





52 programmes running in 48 countries

In 2024, the diversity of our programmes was showcased with 2 new countries joining our portfolio, whilst others marked more than ten years of NNHF partnership. One of these long-term partners is Hemophilia Federation (India), who was awarded the NNHF Project of the Year Award for outstanding progress towards systemic change. Panama, another long-term partner country, is the home of NNHF Community Award winner Alaisa Arauz de Melgar, whose dedication helped the patient organisation become an inspiration for the region.

IMPACT IN 2024

Total beneficiaries **55,700**

The NNHF programmes running in 2024 benefitted 49,900 people living with bleeding disorders. An additional 5,800 people living with sickle cell disease were reached through programmes taking an integrated approach to haemophilia and haemoglobinopathies.¹

PORTFOLIO HIGHLIGHTS

2024 saw the completion of ten NNHF programmes, spanning four continents. Here are some of the highlights.

Embarking on haemophilia care strengthening

Four countries across Africa, Côte d'Ivoire, Republic of Congo, Burkina Faso and Sierra Leone, saw the successful completion of their first NNHF supported projects in 2024 with a focus on increasing diagnostic services and establishing care.





Haemophilia was incorporated into the NCD lists/programmes in Côte d'Ivoire and Republic of Congo, and recognised as a chronic condition in Burkina Faso, making it eligible for Universal Health Care.



Sierra Leone saw a 10-hour reduction in travel time to diagnosis (round trip), Côte d'Ivoire achieved a 100% increase in the number of people diagnosed, and 9 regional labs were established in Burkina Faso thanks to a public private partnership with Sysmex.

Supporting long-term partnerships for systemic change

Reflecting our long-term engagement with partners in Romania, Azerbaijan and Thailand, NNHF supported projects in these countries reflected a different phase of haemophilia care development, where systems strengthening and decentralisation have resulted in:



The establishment of a Regional Training Centre in Thailand, which trained healthcare professionals from Nepal in 2024, with an Indonesian training cohort planned for early 2025.



A 35% increase in government budget allocation to haemophilia in Azerbaijan between 2022 and 2024, free dental care for all people with haemophilia and 81% of people with haemophilia surveyed observing positive changes in their health outcomes.



A diagnosis rate increase from 59% to 71% in Romania, which took its final step to decentralising care and diagnosis and is now ready to support its neighbouring countries.

A holistic approach in Latin America

Our tailored approach means NNHF programmes respond to partner's needs. In 2024, this saw the completion of innovative initiatives in Latin America.



Reduced joint damage was observed in 60% of registered patients in North-Western Argentina, thanks to the project's focus on improving musculoskeletal care, whilst the number of people able to self-infuse increased sevenfold, with 37% of the patient population now capable of self-infusion.



Regional guidelines aimed at improving support for haemophilia carriers were produced for distribution in seven countries in the region.
