AT A GLANCE

58 programmes running in **49** countries

In 2023, we grew our portfolio of collaborative country programmes involving multiple partners, including an East Africa project for Kenya, Rwanda, Tanzania and Uganda, and an initiative focusing on women affected by bleeding disorders in eight countries across Latin America. We also celebrated two new Award recipients: Argentina for the Project of the Year and Madagascar, whose Prof Rakoto Alson won the Community Award. The following pages highlight some of the ways that people with haemophilia benefitted from NNHF programmes in 2023.

Advocating for systemic change

In 2023, we increased our focus on supporting our partners to advocate for systemic change. Through such efforts, 20% of countries reported new or increased budget allocation for haemophilia and allied disorders⁵. Other advocacy uptakes reported by our partners include government endorsement of national treatment guidelines and the approval of home treatment.

Progressing on an advocacy journey in Nepal

The Nepal Hemophilia Society (NHS) has continued to make impressive strides in its advocacy journey by engaging provincial hospital authorities. Seeking to expand their advocacy knowledge, they met with Hemophilia Federation (India) and a national advocacy expert in late 2023. That same year, their ongoing advocacy efforts paid off, with two provinces allocating budget to haemophilia care. This means all provinces in the country have now committed budget to the condition since NHS began their advocacy journey, marking a 100% national increase in the amount allocated over the year.

Increasing diagnosis in Eastern Romania

A combination of multidisciplinary team training, improved diagnosis facilities and excellent teamwork with the Asociatia Romana de Hemofilie paved the way for a targeted awareness raising campaign in Iasi, Eastern Romania. This has so far led to a 71% increase in the number of people diagnosed in the area in 2023 alone.

Restoring joint mobility in Honduras

Physiotherapist training, a new rehabilitation room and an awareness campaign on the importance of appropriate shoes led to a major improvement in the joint health of people living with haemophilia in Honduras. This includes regained mobility in the knees in some cases and a reduced chance of future disability.
